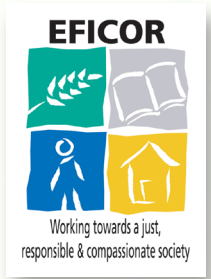


# ANDHRA PRADESH FLOOD RELIEF



**UPDATE 1**

## Introduction

On the 29<sup>th</sup> August, 2024, the state of Andhra Pradesh has experienced heavy rainfall. The state has received 27% more rainfall than its annual average, totalling 548.40 mm against the normal 429.10 mm. This excessive rainfall has led to extreme flooding across multiple districts, including NTR, Krishna districts. The floods have resulted in the displacement of over 41,927 individuals into 176 relief shelters statewide. The total number of people affected across the state is approximately 419,270. Significant damage has occurred to residential properties, agricultural lands, and infrastructure, including roads and bridges. The floods resulted in at least 35 deaths in NTR district and significantly impacted approximately 270,000 people in Vijayawada alone. The disaster was characterized by over 29 cm of rainfall in a single day, which overwhelmed the Krishna River and Budameru Rivulet. The flooding caused extensive damage to infrastructure, homes, and agricultural land. The extreme rainfall caused catastrophic flooding, severely damaging infrastructure, homes, and agricultural land.

EFICOR staff who is based at Vijayawada for Unicef's WASH project, was involved in needs assessment along with people Trained by EFICOR on Integral Mission. After the needs assessment, the team has finalized the response kit in close collaboration with local government authorities and community members.

## EFICOR Response

EFICOR has conducted an assessment and identified 1,200 families in the NTR District, specifically in the areas of Ibrahimpatnam and Vijayawada, who have been severely affected. These families were in urgent need of relief assistance. This includes the distribution of both food and non-food items to meet their immediate needs, as well as cash transfers to help them recover and rebuild their lives in the aftermath of the disaster

## Selection & Finalization

Needy and Vulnerable Families such as People with Disability, Low-Income Families, Widows, and Elderly who were affected by the floods were identified to support.

## Adherence to CHS standards

EFICOR being a CHS-certified organization has been adhering to CHS standards and the 9 commitments to ensure that the beneficiaries are treated with dignity and ensured inconvenience is minimal while deciding about distributing points. A complaint handling mechanism was in place and the beneficiaries were well informed about it.

## Kobo Update Status

A total of 500 beneficiaries were successfully updated in the KOBO system for the distribution of Food and Non-Food Items. In addition, the Cash Benefit Transfer data has been completed for 244 beneficiaries out of the targeted 700, ensuring that the process is progressing steadily toward reaching all those in need.

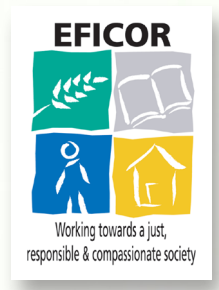


## Distribution activity updates as of 21-9-2024

500 Kits (Food and Non-Food items) distribution program was organized in Ibrahimpatnam Mandal, Andhra Pradesh, with the presence of the local MLA (Mr. Vasant Krishna Prasad). The current flood situation was discussed with the beneficiaries, along with essential information on nutrition and health. The session included an interactive discussion with the community before the distribution, emphasizing the importance of health, as captured in the phrase "Health is Wealth." The MLA highlighted how hygiene plays a crucial role in maintaining health and can significantly reduce the spread of diseases, especially in flood-affected areas.
